

'Canadians close-minded'

LONDON (CP) — Vancouver-born artist Joy Caros says Canadians are close-minded about art and refuse to recognize her artistic achievement.

During a joint exhibition with husband and fellow artist James Rawlings at Hamilton's Art Gallery, Caros said her work, although widely accepted in Europe, has won little praise in her native land.

"Unless you're painting something Canadian the country won't look at you as a Canadian artist," asserted Caros.

Caros says she is the only contemporary artist in Europe who has "perfected the technique of painting oil on velvet" although there are examples at the Louvre and the Vatican of earlier works in this medium.

"I started painting with oil on velvet 20 years ago because of the challenge. It's difficult and demands patience. There's simply no room for error."

Her subjects are people — nudes, faces and aesthetic figures representing human drama against a black-velvet background.

"I try to convey emotion, feeling and tragedy through the human figure. We are life. Why should I return to Canada and paint landscapes?"

Caros began sculpting and painting more than 20 years ago, earning recognition throughout Canada.

After a solo show in Toronto in 1963, Hollywood producer Stanley Kramer invited her to paint the portraits of the 13 characters in his film *It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World*.

The London exhibition, the first for Caros since her London Hilton exhibit in 1968, is Rawlings' London debut. He began painting in 1976.

Now living in Astad, Switzerland, Caros and Rawlings are planning to return to Canada for a private exhibition in Toronto in May of 1980.

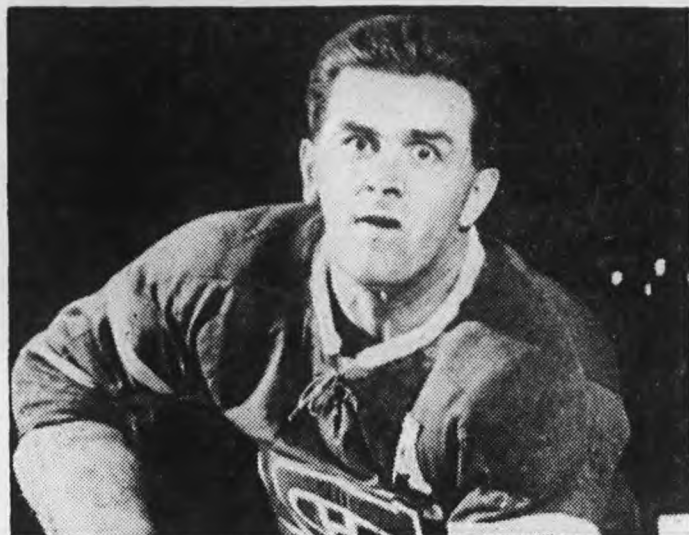
