



U.S. Vote High For Mid-Term

WASHINGTON (AP) — When the counting is finished it's almost certain to show more Americans voted Tuesday than in any mid-term election, but as usual—not anywhere near that of a presidential year. With scattered voting districts yet to be counted and thousands of absentee ballots to be tabulated, an Associated Press survey shows an unofficial total of 56,146,618 tallied so far. That's near the final 56,827,994 total of 1966 and well over the 53,510,425 in 1962. The 1960 presidential vote was 68,883,341 and the 1968 total was 73,359,968.

Court News

PRISONER STUDENT
For the next six months, an Ottawa marijuana trafficker will probably spend nights and weekends in prison and his days at school. Terrence Scanlon, 24, 30 McEwen Avenue, was given this option Thursday by Judge L. A. Sherwood when he sentenced the Carleton University student for possession of \$1,600 of marijuana intended for trafficking; and for straight possession of another \$30 worth of the drug. He was charged Sept. 9. Judge Sherwood said he might have placed Scanlon on probation, because he was a good risk, but said that would have been "writing a licence" to other university students to traffic.

BOOKMAKING CHARGE
Charles Albert Gaul, 29, 365 George Street, arrested Nov. 4 at Rideau-Carleton Raceway by Gloucester police, was remanded to Nov. 19 on "engaging in bookmaking... by accepting bets on results of races." Detectives had been observing persons who illegally run bets for raceway patrons and also finance the bets. No large amounts were involved, it was learned.

Two Exhibit Paintings, Sculpture

Tony Dufour who is noted for his sculpture and wood carving is exhibiting his works at L'Institut Canadien-Francais, 316 Dalhousie Street. And another gifted artist Paul Baril from Ottawa is holding his first one-man show of 25 paintings. The two-man show continues until Sunday. This viewer admired Baril's "Summer Feast." Still life landscapes, portraits, acrylic abstracts are shown revealing a considerable talent. Mr. Dufour's dragon head floor lamps were much admired. He uses cherrywood and wrought iron. Another stunning lamp for table use was made of copper combined with wood. Mr. Dufour also exhibits a number of masks including "Fang" and his conception of an ancient Roman governor. L'Institut Canadien-Francais was established in 1952 by Ottawa's mayor Paul Emile Turgeon. The club now has a membership of 800 leading French Canadians. Mr. Baril is the son of Lionel Baril, treasurer of L'Institut. He has the singular gift of veering from the representational to the abstract suggesting a refreshing spontaneity in both.—WQK.

Mill Spends \$11 Million

ST. CATHARINES, Ont. (CP) —The Ontario Paper Co. Ltd. will spend \$17.2 million on a two-year capital expansion and pollution-control program at its Thorold mill near here, President Robert M. Schmon said Thursday. Mr. Schmon said the company's effluent and waste control program will cost \$8.5 million. The program was announced a year ago, with projected costs of \$5 million. The plant produces synthetic vanilla — used primarily for pharmaceutical uses — made from by-products recovered in the newsprint manufacturing process. The company's programs to curb pollution has included a \$750,000 clarifier to remove eight tons a day of suspended solids and a \$1.7 million facility to remove 40 tons a day of sodium sulphate from the mill's waste products. A third step in the program, said Mr. Schmon, will include evaporation and burning of dissolved sugars and cellulose materials.


